

Huntly to Greenmyres **Eco Bothy**

Huntly Square Greenmyres Eco Bothy



The cycle/walk route to Greenmyres eco-bothy uses a mixture of quiet roads, farm / windfarm tacks, and a loosely bound cycle path, (put in by the Huntly Development trust). The route is marked with areen arrows on wooden signs. Suitable for hybrid / mountain bikes.

Start from The Square in Huntly and head east down Duke Street, until turning right onto Gladstone Road. At the end of Gladstone Road take a left at the allotments onto a track crossing a **blue bridge** () over the River Bogie, continue down a path to the A96. Follow path alongside the A96 until reaching a crossing point to head up Ba' Hill. Walk for 50 metres then turn left at at junction.

Continue along this guiet road for 2km, going past Ba' Hill woodland. When the road turns into a dirt track carry on straight, until reaching the start of the grassy **path on the right 3** after a pedestrian gate. Head uphill on this grassy path, passing through a further gate. Once at the crest of the hill there is another gate on the left with a sign pointing to **Greenmyres**, 4 head through this gate and follow the cycle track down the hill meeting a minor road.

Once on the Gartly road turn left and follow the road for 100 meters then turn right along a farm track, 6 taking you up past **Dummuies farm** and into Dummuies windfarm. Upon reaching the wind farm take a right through the gate and carry on to the end of the track.

At the end of the track (next to a wind turbine) take a left through the wooden gate and onto the cycle path. (3) Follow the path, ignoring the turn off for Gartly Moor. The eco bothy will be visible on the left.
